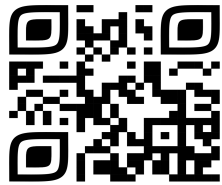

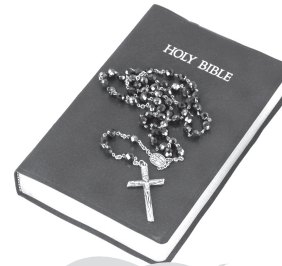
We are a non-profit, 501(3)(c) corporation staff ed solely by volunteers.

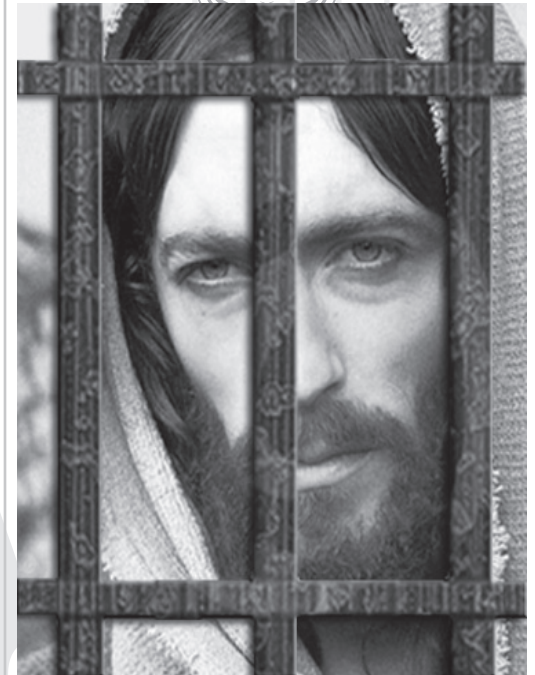

## About Us

Residents Encounter Christ (REC) is an interdenominational, Christian ministry that brings the Good News of God's grace to the residents in jails.

During a 3-day REC experience, a team of about 35 men and women from different walks of life, both lay people and clergy, enter a correctional facility to share their Christian love with those inside the jails.

Through a series of talks and group discussions, we teach priorities and goal setting, and encourage a strong faith as a way of life for their future.

Volunteers continue to encourage the residents by attending 'gatherings' in the jails as a way to help them in their spiritual growth.
